Decision No. GREYDLC 154/2024

IN THE MATTER of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act

2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER of an application by **DOBSON BOWLING**

CLUB INCORPORATED pursuant to s.138 of the Act for an on-site Special Licence in respect of premises situated at 70 Omapere Street, Dobson and known

as the "Dobson Bowling Club"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

Dobson Bowling Club Inc has made an application for a special licence to sell and supply alcohol for two events at 70 Omapere Street, Dobson to allow non-members to attend.

The applicant is an incorporated society number 302532 and holds a current Club licence number 55/CLUB/64/2015. The current licensed hours are Sunday to Thursday - 9am to 12 midnight, Friday and Saturday - 9am to 1am the following day and Christmas Eve and New Years Eve - 12 noon to 1am the following day.

The events are bowling tournaments with an estimated number of 60-70 people attending, with a probable age distribution of 17-70 years.

The proposed hours applied for are:

Friday 7th February 2025, Saturday 8th February 2025 and Sunday 9th February 2025	Men's West Coast Open 4's	11am to 7.00pm

The premise's principal entrance is from Omapere Street, Dobson.

The whole of the premises is undesignated, as per the plan submitted with the application.

DECISION

The Grey District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 **grants** an application by Dobson Bowling Club Incorporated for an on-site Special Licence for premises at 70 Omapere Street, Dobson and known as the "Dobson Bowling Club", subject to the following conditions:

CONDITIONS

1. Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days during the following hours:

DAY	EVENT	HOURS
Saturday 11th January 2025	Dobson All Day 4's	11am to 7.00pm
Friday 7th February 2025, Saturday 8th February 2025 and Sunday 9th February 2025	Men's West Coast Open 4's	11am to 7.00pm

- 2. The whole area of the premises is undesignated for the licence period and is shown on the plan attached to this licence.
- 3. A certified duty manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
- 4. The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale or supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - Minors and intoxicated persons must not be served alcohol.
- 5. The licensee must display signage as follows:

- a. A sign at each principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by patrons, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of alcohol;
- b. At every point of sale detailing restriction on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
- c. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises and;
- d. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.
- 6. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcoholic beverages.
- 7. Food, as listed by the applicant must be available for consumption on the premises during the licence hours.
- 8. Drinking water is to be provided free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
- 9. The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
- 10. Noise levels are to be monitored at all times.
- 11. Payment of the fee prescribed under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Fees) Regulations 2013.

The premises licensed area is set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 18 November 2024. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The applicant has previously hosted these tournaments for the last ten years with no cause for concern.

The applicant has provided in their application host responsibility details which demonstrate that suitable measures will be undertaken to provide the following measures with regard to the responsible sales or supply of alcohol, and that harm will be minimised by:

- Food, in the form of ham on the bone, salads, savouries and other items as per the attached menu, will be available on the premises during the licence hours.
- Free water will be available at the bar at no charge throughout the event.
- Non-alcoholic and low alcoholic beverages will be available.

There is one certified duty manager, Nigeal Kelleher, who is an experienced manager and he will be supported by one other club member.

The Inspector's report indicates that the amenity and good order of the locality will not be adversely affected by more than a minor extent and that the applicant is suitable to hold this licence. She does not oppose this application.

The Police and the Medical Officer of Health raise no matters in opposition.

The application was not required to be publicly notified and no opposition or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

Accordingly, I deal with the matter on the papers.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act.

Section 149(2) notes if a special licence issued is postponed to some other day, the licence is in force on the day on which the event or part takes place.
