Town Square Trial Closure - How to have your say



At their meeting on Monday 14 December 2020, the Grey District Council made the decision to trial weekend and public holiday closures of the Tainui Shared Street/Town Square area to improve the vibrancy and atmosphere within the Greymouth CBD.

The trial period was approved for every weekend and public holiday from Friday 18 December 2020 until Monday 5 April 2021. This means the road will be closed off to vehicles on Fridays from 4pm and reopened on Monday mornings at 7am. The closure will be extended by a day to include public holidays when necessary.

To try and create a welcoming environment, planter boxes will be used to close the road for the duration of the trial, while allowing access for emergency and service vehicles.



Over the period of December 2020 to April 2021, Council will be measuring the success of the trial through surveys and feedback from the community and businesses. Council is putting together a schedule of events and these will be advertised on our website and Facebook page. Members of the public, groups and organisations are invited to use the space for busking, markets and events and can phone our Community Facilitator to book a day and time on 027 263 2650.

We also hope the public will take the opportunity to use this area more as a community and hang out space. From a Council perspective, we have many shovel ready projects that we need to manage and deliver well. These give us the opportunity to build to the highest quality to future proof our infrastructure. A number of these will be starting in the next few months and will offer significant employment opportunities in the region. We also have a 10-year plan that we are working on, as well as continuing provision of the 45 services that we manage in the community.

Last year Council entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Government to receive funding (\$3.84m) and provide information on our water and wastewater assets. Water reforms are on the way but at this stage, we do not have any clear direction from Government. It is a situation we are watching closely as our communities own their water assets and deserve a say in how they are managed.

A significant challenge our community faces is a growing housing shortage. The Mayors of

our region have been meeting and advocating strongly with the agencies involved to get some action to help speed up solutions to this ever-growing problem. Many other regions in the country are facing this issue, some on a much larger scale than us. We must continue to advocate strongly so this issue remains at the forefront of the agencies concerned. Everyone deserves a warm roof over their head and our district needs the skilled workers that are currently struggling or deciding not to bring their talents to the Coast because they can't find long term accommodation.

I am looking forward to 2021 and to watching the progress of the projects we have underway that, once completed, will benefit our district.

Responsible Freedom Camping in the Grey District



It is great to see the new responsible freedom camping signage in place at the Cobden Breakwater site. The Responsible Freedom Camping Bylaw was adopted by Council in November 2020.

The changes to the bylaw mean there are now a restricted number of sites available for responsible freedom camping in the carpark area. The rest of the area is available for day time/sightseeing parking only. Council feels that this will allow better access for locals and sightseers to enjoy the location as well as accommodating certified campers in the area.

The Cobden Bridge site has also been tidied up with a new area for campers to park on; previously this area was very boggy and caused issues when people drove on it.

New signage will be installed around the other responsible freedom camping sites over the next few months.

Our preferred payment for Rates and other debtor accounts is now by Direct Debit. Paying by Direct Debit allows you to make payments to suit your budget without incurring a penalty. We offer a variety of time periods, including weekly, fortnightly, monthly, quarterly or annually for Rates accounts.

Jodie, Johanna and Rachael will help deliver the Library's free digital literacy classes and the weekly Device Advice @ the Library sessions. They will also offer a Monday afternoon drop-in session at 1.30pm for those seeking assistance with the creation of CVs, cover letters and online job applications.

Internal Affairs Minister Tracey Martin says "Libraries play a vital role as a community hub and they can be the places where people can get real practical help during tough economic times. This new money and range of initiatives recognises the role that libraries play. It's a much-needed boost to keep these services going and support the New Zealand public through the recovery."

Community funding

The Grey District Council administers the following funding rounds that are available to groups in our community. See below for details of each fund.

Contestable Grants Fund - NEW FUND

The Contestable Grants Fund is a new fund introduced by the Council to assist in the vision of becoming a thriving, connected and resilient Grey District. Applications are called for each year in July/August.

There has been \$20,000 allocated from Council for this fund. The grant applications will need to align with Council's vision and outcomes, which have been updated following community engagement undertaken between February and June 2020.

Creative Communities Scheme

This fund offers financial support for emerging and established artists, art practitioners, groups and organisations. All projects eligible for funding must be arts and cultural projects that increases participation in the arts at a local level or increases the range and diversity of the arts available to local communities.

Funding rounds for the Creative New Zealand Fund are usually open in April and September each year.

Sport New Zealand Rural Travel Fund

This fund is designed to help subsidise rural travel for junior teams aged between 5-19 years. It helps school and club sports teams participate in local sporting competitions. Funding rounds for the Sport New Zealand Rural Travel Fund are in April and September each year.


West Coast Amateur Sports Trust
