

NEW LIBRARY & COMMUNITY HUB



The Grey District is getting a new library. Our designers have worked with our funding partners to decide how big the building will be and the basic layout. Now it's time for you to share what you think should be included in the interior and fit out.

What we have done

Grey District Council has entered into a Council Controlled Organisation (CCO) joint venture partnership with Development West Coast to construct a new building that will be a new home for our library & community hub, along with retail space in Greymouth's Central Business District.

This partnership is supported by additional funding form Kānoa – Regional Economic Development & Investment Unit (MBIE) and Better Off Funding. The opportunity to secure this funding meant the library project has been brought forward and has dictated the size and shape of the building.

We've spoken to our library team, our designers have consulted with specialist library designers and now we want to hear from our community about what you want to see in the library.

Why we believe in this project

- Libraries are community spaces
- This is a chance to ensure we include things that will benefit our entire community
- We can look at more children's activities and areas
- We want to provide a space that is safe, fun and engaging
- We'd like to see an increase in younger people using the spaces and facilities
- This new facility will encourage people to be in the CBD area
- We have a chance to offer more space for community and school visits
- Our design can create space for people to use a variety of changing technology
- Our library patronage is growing and this is an opportunity to invest in the future of our district

As a library our first priority is to offer a space that encourages people to use our services and resources, a public space that offers something for everyone.

We have a blank canvas on which to place all the wonderful, creative and important things our library can offer its community.



Technology spaces that allow people to put into practice things they have researched and can implement. For example 3D printing, podcasting and music production.




Adult fiction

Encouraging use through modernising the space and how the books are displayed. Space to sit and relax.



Meeting / teaching / performance rooms

Functional spaces for meetings, for larger groups and for larger activities. Spaces can be divided into multi-room options through use of fold-away walls.



Space to read, relax, research and interact for teens. Gaming consoles and television for fostering a positive place for teens from around the district to come and spend time.



Heritage displays

Alcoves and spaces to display our heritage items and artifacts. Changeable spaces for sharing our history and local art.

Children's area



Better division of space for kids to use. A safer space for parents with younger children. Space designed for more interactive sessions.

Large shared parent's room located nearby.

Study / breakout rooms Spaces for quiet study. Zoom

Spaces for quiet study, Zoom calls and small groups. Useful for interviews or Justice of the Peace appointments. Could be bookable or drop-in.



Reading areas

Comfortable seating and the best view in town will encourage people to slow down, enjoy the space and the facilities, and make the most of this special place.



Café

The cafe offers a new gathering space. Coffee and free Wifi will be available, encouraging people to relax and use it as a gathering space in town.
