## Note to submitter

If you are making a submission to the Environmental Protection Authority, you should use form 16B.

The closing date for serving submissions on the consent authority is the 20th working day after the date on which public or limited notification is given. If the application is subject to limited notification, the consent authority may adopt an earlier closing date for submissions once the consent authority receives responses from all affected persons.

You must serve a copy of your submission on the applicant as soon as is reasonably practicable after you have served your submission on the consent authority.

If you are a trade competitor, your right to make a submission may be limited by the trade competition provisions in Part 11A of the Resource Management Act 1991.

If you make a request under section 100A of the Resource Management Act 1991, you must do so in writing no later than 5 working days after the close of submissions and you may be liable to meet or contribute to the costs of the hearings commissioner or commissioners. #### REASONS FOR SUBMISSION

### **Economic**

- The proposed mineral sands operation has already benefitted the local community in the form of accommodating people who have carried out assessments on the property to provide the reports include in the applicant's submission. This included time within the pandemic when tourism was non-existent.
- The economic benefits of the mine will affect the immediate community, the Grey District and West Coast region. These include \$63 million of export earnings per year, once fully operational, and boosting Grey District's exports by 46% per year.
- TiGa's Economic Impacts report estimates the mine will create 57 directly employed jobs and 80 new support jobs elsewhere in the economy, the majority of which are likely to be filled by local or regional residents. Mining jobs are amongst the highest paid on the West Coast and contribute to a higher wage economy for our community.
- The applicant has signalled the use of local businesses throughout the life of mining operations.

#### Environment

- Mining activities are a common and anticipated part of the rural environment on the West Coast and in the Grey District. This is recognised in local planning documents such as the West Coast Regional Policy Statement, the Grey District Plan and the proposed Te Tai o Poutini Plan. The latter includes a Minerals Extraction Zone, within which the proposed TiGa site is included.
- The land in question is privately owned farmland. The site has, in the past, obviously been extensively contoured with heavy machinery to aid drainage. It is not virgin land and does not contain any significant native flora or fauna as per the expert reports included in the TiGa Minerals Ltd application.
- TiGa's application assesses environmental effects, including assessments carried out by relevant experts. TiGa demonstrates that the proposed activity can be managed acceptably. A range of conditions will be able to be imposed on a resource consent to ensure the activity does not give rise to unacceptable environmental impacts.
- The impacts of mining activities are well known and can be managed via appropriate conditions and monitoring. The resource consent application and volunteered conditions appropriately deal with any actual and potential adverse effects.
- The proposed activity has progressive rehabilitation which will restore the land back to productive farmland which will be more easily farmed due to enhanced drainage.
- Native plantings will be carried out on the site providing habitat for native fauna, enhancement of the historic mining lagoon on the beachfront of the site and other freshwater water bodies.
- Lighting, traffic movements and extensive monitoring will be put in place to guard against any negative affects to the at-risk Westland Black Petrel that is located in the area
- Extensive avian protection and monitoring will take place as per the report by EcoLogical Solutions provided in the TiGa Minerals Ltd application.
- The mine site is set well back from the ocean frontage and the rehabilitation plan shows that the land will be returned back to its original height above sea level. Therefore, guarding against sea inundation and erosion.

# Traffic

The proposed mine site is situated on a state highway that services both Westport and Greymouth. It is already used by heavy traffic. As per the report by Novo Group "Overall, the proposal can be supported from a traffic perspective and the effects on the traffic environment can be considered as being less than minor."
