The Barrytown flats have been heavily mined in the past, so mining is not a new industry to the area. The Te Tai O Poutini plan recognises the Barrytown Flats and the proposed mining area as minerals extraction zone. Being the owner of land that has been dredged in the past for gold, the land has been and is stable, and highly productive. This signals that the short term use of private land for mining purposes will not compromise the viable agricultural use of land in the future. It is our view, private land owned that has the opportunity to be mined by TIGA, can be sustainably returned to productive agricultural land or high value ecological areas.

There is a lot of dialogue surrounding the truck traffic expected. Our house is within 50m of the Coast Road, our experience is that motorbikes and old cars generate the greatest amount of noise pollution. Milk tankers that run day and night are not noticeable. While the Coast road is lauded for its tourism value is this not for that great variation in scenery that is encountered from farming, native bush, sea and small communities? The Coast road is also the main commercial and domestic road for businesses and families living/operating along the Coast and in Westport and Greymouth. The predicted three truck and trailer movements per hour, in our view, is safe and sustainable.

Barrytown has an aging infrastructure, retiring population and some local assets have struggled to survive such as the All Nations Hotel. The Community hall and school are all reliant on community volunteers for their prosperity. Here is a great opportunity for benefitting the Barrytown community and wider West Caost economy for a higher wage paying economy that will bring in families to revitalise the area.

The application provided by TIGA support uses of local business and labour which will benefit our local and wider Grey District and West Coast economy and community, which we support.

This is a newer form of mining that does not involve green house gas producing petrochemicals or coal.

At present the areas proposed for mining have limited biodiversity and water way plantings. It is our view, the rehabilitated land can offer increased habitats for fishes and birds, and higher environmental protections in place for future agriculture/ecological use.

We support the growth of the new long-term mineral sand industry provided by TIGA on the Barrytown Flats and West Coast. We support this application.
