Submission

I oppose the application due to:

- 1. The Barrytown area is a populated rural area and I believe that industrial mining would be very damaging on the people, the community and the environment, resulting in adverse effects across the whole region.
- 2. I see no economic benefit to this proposal, because the beneficiaries are mostly based overseas.
- 3. State Highway 6 is already a dangerous road and shouldn't be used continuously 7 days a week, and particularly on public holidays by heavy trucking.
- 4. The damage to State Highway 6 and cost of repairs, due to the increase of heavy trucking traffic is expensive and unacceptable. The risk will be greater to all users because of this increase in traffic.
- 5. The beautiful coastal environment would be negatively affected because of the view grade degradation of such a project.
- 6. The Westland petrel population is unique and should not be threatened by any increased activity interrupting their breeding region and flight paths. Additional unnatural lighting complicates their already diminishing population.
- 7. The Zero Carbon Act to decarbonize to a low emissions economy should be respected and this mining proposal does not take into consideration the requirements of this act.
- 8. The West Coast Regional Council's "Untamed Natural Wilderness" strategy is completely undermined by this proposal.
- 9. I see nothing in this proposal that will protect the environment as stated in the Resource Management Act and other designed to protect the environment.

I seek the following decision from the Local Authority: that the application be declined in its entirety.
