I owned a property at Motukiekie on the Coast Road (halfway between Rapahoe and Barrytown) for 34 years. I was a teacher and involved in several tourism ventures on the West Coast, and raised my children at Motukiekie. We had many international and New Zealand visitors to stay and we enjoyed showing them the area.

I oppose the TIGa mining application as it would have harmful effects on the Westland petrel (taiko). The use of artificial lighting at the proposed mining site and the lights on trucks driven on State Highway 6 between Greymouth and Westport at night would disorientate the Westland petrel on their flight paths, the little blue penguin (Korora) looking for nesting sites, fernbirds and the great spotted kiwi. Therefore, the TIGa mining operation should not be allowed to operate during any hours of darkness. Policy 11 (a and b) of the New Zealand Coastal Policy Statement would be breached if the TIGa mining application was approved, due to the adverse effects on the Westland petrel and other at-risk birds in the surrounding coastal environment. The noise and dust from the proposed mining operation and the trucks would also seriously disturb the birds and their habitat and would cause an environmental health hazard to birds, fish, insects and people.

I oppose the TIGa mining application as the proposed increase in the number of trucks using State Highway 6 between Westport and Greymouth would be a serious safety issue. State Highway 6 is a narrow scenic coastal highway prone to major slips and erosion, and has several bluffs with blind corners that are difficult for trucks to manoeuvre at times without crossing over the midline of the highway. With an increase in tourism traffic, trucks and other vehicles, State Highway 6 would become a more dangerous highway to drive, cycle and walk along for tourists and local residents. It would also be difficult for people to enter in to and exit out of driveways safely along State Highway 6 with the increase of trucks and other vehicles in the area if the proposed TIGa mining application was approved.

I oppose the TIGa mining application as it would have serious effects on tourism in the area. Some tourists may decide not to visit the area if there was an increase in the number of trucks on the highway due to safety issues and the potential noise from trucks and the proposed mining operation. Tourists like to experience the scenic, peaceful and wild beauty of the West Coast environment.
