I strongly oppose the application primarily on environmental, traffic and social grounds. I am in no way a competitor of the mining company but make this submission as a West Coast resident and person who drives the West Coast Road frequently for family reasons.

I oppose the application on environmental grounds. It is not possible that such deep open mining does not affect the hydrology of the area and so the environmental well being of zones adjacent to the mine activity. So adversely affecting and killing the native plants and animal currently living there. This is not nothing

I oppose the application on the grounds of the dense heavy traffic movements it will create on the Coast Road. I mention tourists. This is currently listed of one of the ten best motoring drives in the country. So many truck movements will adversely affect the appreciation of the drive and so tourist numbers will fall. Whatever people say the West Coast is still heavily dependent of tourist income.
