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In a brief period as Disputes Tribunal Referee I had to deal with claims arising out of the driving conditions on this highway.

My former home was close to Bakers Creek. On occasions milk tankers overturned on the 17 Mile Bluff so am concerned that more large vehicles might increase this hazard.

The bridge over Baker's Creek was close to my home and we had to contact NZTA as the heavy traffic made our home shake. The bridge had to be worked on to repair the damage due to trucks so more trucks might make this a more frequent requirement.
